As we no longer have our resident doctor and nurse so unfortunately we can’t provide primary healthcare service.

However, we will provide dental care with 3 professional volunteer staff from overseas who will join our resident dentist Rowena Kang preparing for our own outreach in October to Waikubukubu village and Vatukoula. We will also help with exercise classes and healthy eating advice. We can also give out reading glasses and test eyesight.

2. Visiting teams - Outreach

- a) We continue to host one of the BSN (Bible Study for the Nations) courses with 15 students and staff. We are providing the cooking and care-taking services. The other team we hosted has now returned to New Zealand and will be graduating.
- b) Team from Soongsil University, Korea: July 10-21st. The team of students were well prepared for their outreach on Rabi Island and were very well received and welcomed. They spent their time doing house visits, church ministry and visiting schools. In Lautoka they visited the prison where they conducted a service with the men

We were particularly excited, especially Rowena to know that this team from SGC is the first Filipino team to come here on a mission trip and that they shared how this trip has matured their relationship with God and their attitude to missions.

3. Truck Fundraising update

We are actively fundraising for a new truck to take the clinic out to the villages. We rely on the truck as we pack the entire clinic and all the kitchen equipment onto it. The old one was made in 1993 and now needs to be replaced.

We are excited to have already raised **\$75,000** and \$45,000 still remains for the purchase of a new 4X4 crew cab truck. We are grateful for God's provision so far! Please prayerfully consider supporting us financially to raise the rest of the money we need to purchase this truck.

Our Prayers

1. We continue to pray for permanent medical staff to join the team for a minimum of 2 years and also for DTS staff. We work closely with the Fijian health service so a resident medical contact is required. Rowena Kang is our permanent dentist and she has built a team of volunteers to go into the field on outreach. The next outreach is for 2 weeks in October.
2. DTS in 2018. We are now advertising and have several enquiries from both staff and students. We are currently in prayer for our outreaches in Fiji and the Cook Islands and our 2 week outreach in Fiji.

By land and sea we have reached many of the more remote villages and communities around Fiji, providing Dental, Optical, Ophthalmology (Cataract Surgery) and Primary Health Care services. From 2002-2017 we have provided care for more than 57 000 Fijians to the glory of God!
